### FUND COMMENTARY

The past quarter was the first negative one for the MSCI World (AC TR) index since the third quarter of 2015. This is also true for the S&P 500 and Dow indices. Although it was only a moderately negative quarter (-1.0% for the World index), investors may wonder whether it may be indicative of the immediate outlook and whether the equity asset class is now out of favour for longer term investing.

The first point to make is that the stretch of nine positive quarters in succession we just had is the longest this century, and therefore the sacrifice of only -1.0% in return is a small price to pay for such an outstanding record. An analysis of the periods since 1980 (a stretch of over 35 years) when there were successive negative quarters for the World index delivers interesting results. There were only four such periods – starting in the years 1981, 1983, 2000 and 2007. A further analysis of those periods can hopefully shed some light on the current risk for further disappointments.

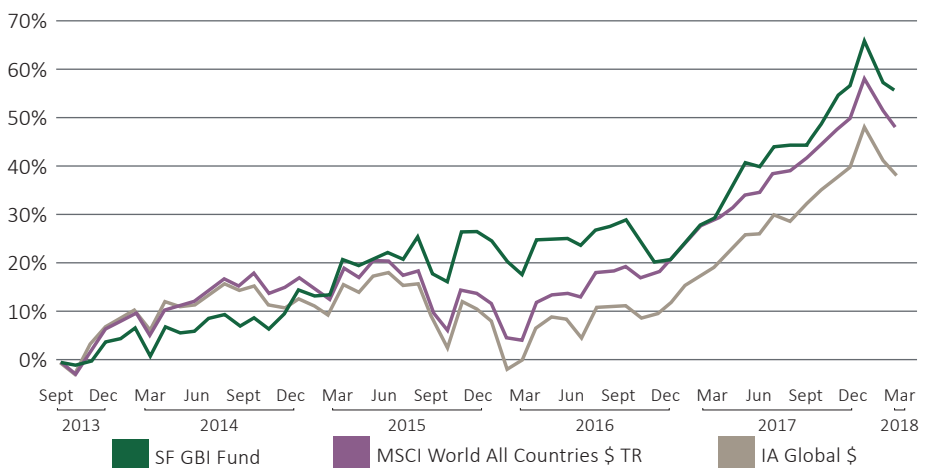
Three of the above periods (1981, 2000 and 2007) were followed shortly afterwards by US recessions, which of course, caused the equity bear markets. In this context, the main question investors therefore face is the level of risk for an imminent US recession. In considering this risk, we are predominantly guided by trusted leading economic indicators. They do not currently offer such signals.

Whilst the 1983 period experienced good economic growth, it was saddled with double digit interest rates following an era of high inflation. Equity valuations were relatively high then compared to interest rates, with the S&P 500 earnings yield around 3% lower than the ten-year treasury yield. Against this, this spread is currently 2% in favour of equities, cheaper than its long-term average of 0%. Furthermore, this spread also does not yet reflect the double-digit earnings growth expected for this year.
