FUND COMMENTARY

There are currently good reasons for optimism about the US economic outlook. Most leading economic indicators have strong readings. Both the Manufacturing and Non-Manufacturing ISM PMI indices registered record readings for March. The Conference Board's Leading Economic Index registered its highest growth in over a decade at 7.9%. General perception is that the US GDP level in real terms will have fully recovered to its pre-pandemic level in the course of the current quarter. This may turn out to be the sharpest US economy V-shape recovery on record.

The US reporting season is in full swing – 60% of the S&P 500 constituents have already reported. Their consolidated sales grew in double digits, and earnings by a half. Whilst these outstanding results were off a low recession-induced base, over three quarters of the reports delivered positive surprises against consensus analyst expectations. Aggregated bottom-up consensus valuations for the S&P 500 constituents accelerated further in April. Shareholders clearly have much to celebrate.

Very interestingly, a general feature of the reporting season is to some extent two contradictory issues – high operational gearing and increasing profitability feature frequently, whilst some reports refer to increasing cost pressures (mostly from supply-chain complications and commodities). This puts the inflation ghost squarely in the spotlight.

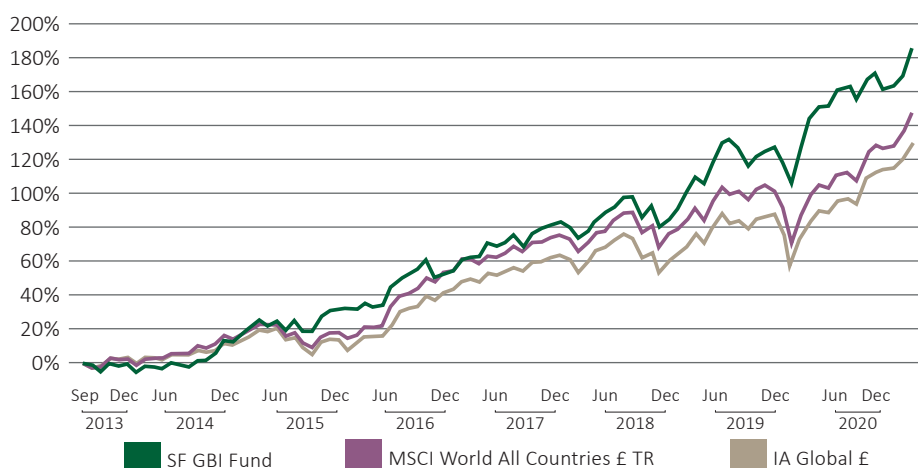
The Federal Reserve sees the 2021 run-up in inflation as 'transitory'. They have good reason for this stance – unemployment is still at 6.2% and overall capacity utilisation at 74.4%, a far cry from high risk 'inflationary' levels of 4% and 80% respectively. Along with this, the long end of the yield curve is currently not progressing with the steepening seen in the first quarter.

US investors currently enjoy a 'goldilocks' environment on almost all fronts. China is taking a conservative stance by tempering their overall liquidity whilst President Biden has further strong stimulatory programmes in place. This is an interesting contrast between the world's largest two economies.

The Fund has been granted consent pursuant to the Control of Borrowing (Jersey) Order 1958, by the Jersey Financial Services Commission ("JFSC") to circulate an offer for subscription, sale or exchange of shares in Jersey. The JFSC is protected by the Control of Borrowing (Jersey) Law 1947, as amended, against liability arising from

the discharge of its functions under that Law. Link Fund Administrators (Ireland) Limited has been appointed as the manager (the "Manager") of the Company and Stonehage Fleming Investment Management Limited has been appointed as the investment manager (the "Investment Manager") of the Company.
