INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Fund is a feeder fund investing only in the Stonehage Fleming Global Best Ideas Equity Fund("Master Fund"), managed by Stonehage Fleming Investment Management Limited in the United Kingdom. The Master Fund seeks to achieve long-term growth in capital and income in a focused portfolio of high quality listed businesses from around the world.

INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

We invest in best of breed businesses for their quality, strategic competitive edge and value.

FUND COMMENTARY

Capital markets were in February predominantly driven by the US inflation reading for January. Headline inflation dropped from 6.5% to 6.4%. The 0.1% drop was less than the expected 0.3% drop. This triggered fears for potential 'sticky' inflation and edged the 2-year Treasury yield up from 4.2% to 4.8% and the 10-year Treasury yield up from 3.5% to 3.9% over the month. The yield curve therefore inverted further from -0.69% to -0.90%. Expectations for the Federal Reserve (Fed) to stop hiking their target rate have been pushed out further. These developments have hurt investor sentiment.

The US economy is predominantly a services driven one. Renewed fears for persistent high US inflation are therefore predominantly based on the low unemployment levels and the implied high wage increases. All this leaves investors with an interesting conundrum.

Whilst current US economic circumstances seem quite buoyant (as reflected in the continued low unemployment and high new employment levels), the inverted yield curve and other leading economic indicators signal weaker economic circumstances on the way. Critically, US wage growth is already in process of moderating from its recent peak of +6.0% to the current +4.4%. Pandemic-inflicted supply chain issues are moderating off a high base. Despite the Ukraine war, this is also the case for food and energy prices.

Whilst this may calm the Fed nerves to some extent, we believe they will remain cautious and continue hiking their target rate by +0.25% increments for another few months to further build their reserves and convincingly dampen wage growth. This may already be the consensus view and new inflation numbers may play a larger role in determining investor sentiment. We do not find enough reason to have meaningful reservations about the potential for a continued downward trend in US inflation.

The largest contributors to the Fund's February performance were Cadence Design Systems, Stryker and Edwards Lifesciences, with Alphabet, Adobe and Estée Lauder the largest detractors.


