FUND COMMENTARY

February delivered a weak global equity market result, with the S&P 500 index wiping out its gains since the US election in November. US stock market volatility increased sharply, with the VIX volatility index rising above the one-year average level. This is in contrast to many European stock markets delivering strong year-to-date performances. This weak US performance is also in contrast to strong US company results for the fourth quarter. The S&P 500 index constituents delivered +5% top-line and $\pm 13\%$ earnings per share growth. These are respectively $\pm 1\%$ and +7% better than consensus expectations.

This year's January and February performances both correlate well with historic norms following a US election, with generally a strong January followed by a weak February. The weak February performance is also put in the context of new employment numbers dropping close to their long-term average, the 10-year Treasury yield dropping, headline inflation rising to 3.0%, Bitcoin dropping over a fifth since its peak and President Trump confirming a range of tariffs, amongst which (seemingly) 25% on both Canada and Mexico and a further 10% on China. Some leading US economic indicators have weakened, but remain constructive. Part of this may though follow from stronger Manufacturing pre-empting the implementation of tariffs.

The best contributors to performance over the month were EssilorLuxottica, Arthur J Gallagher and Visa. The launch last year of the Ray-Ban branded smart glasses in partnership with Meta is starting to benefit EssilorLuxottica's organic growth, and their Nuance branded glasses, with built-in hearing support, have very good potential. Investors buy in to Gallagher's largest ever acquisition currently in process. Visa benefits from its status as a good US inflation hedge.

The largest detractors from performance have been Alphabet, Amazon and Cadence Design systems. Whilst all three businesses have strong earnings growth outlooks, the Technology sector broadly suffers from new uncertainties around the DeepSeek announcement from China of much higher AI efficiencies than at US peers.


