## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

To achieve long-term growth in capital and income in a focused portfolio of high quality listed businesses from around the world.

## INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

We invest in best in class businesses for their quality, strategic competitive edge and value.

## FUND COMMENTARY

The stock market relief rally continued in July, having started with the announcement in April of the 90-day tariff negotiation period. More tariff agreements have since been reached, most notably with China and the European Union. The US economic recovery in the second quarter further supported investment sentiment with US GDP recovering from -0.5% to +3.0%.

Two thirds of the S&P 500 constituents have reported their second calendar quarter results at the time of writing. On a consolidated basis, Revenue/Earnings grew +6%/+9% respectively, with strong surprise factors of +3%/+8% respectively. We consider there to be three main fundamental features with these results. The weak Dollar has, for the first time since 2022, become a tailwind, to the order of ~2%. Further to this, operational efficiencies continue to improve, particularly so in technology related businesses. Lastly, it has become apparent that AI activity is increasing at a rapid rate, to the benefit of those demonstrating their active participation in AI, reflected in their share prices. Any disappointment on this front (or indeed any other) has been severely punished.

The best contributors to performance have been Cadence Design Systems, Alphabet and EssilorLuxottica, all following from strong results. Cadence, in particular, benefits from the strong AI and semiconductor cycle, and the lifting of US sanctions on their services to Chinese clients. Whilst Alphabet succeeded in continuing to grow their advertising income in double digits, their leading AI infrastructure and AI solutions are attracting large customers and result in Google Cloud further boosting the group profitability. The success of EssilorLuxottica's smart glasses is starting to reflect in group results.

The largest detractors from performance have been Netflix, Verisk Analytics, and ASML. Despite its strong results, profit taking following the earlier strong performance brought down Netflix's share price. Verisk announced fair results, but announced an acquisition of which the strategic fit is not immediately apparent. Tariff and client uncertainties continue to weigh on ASML's share performance.

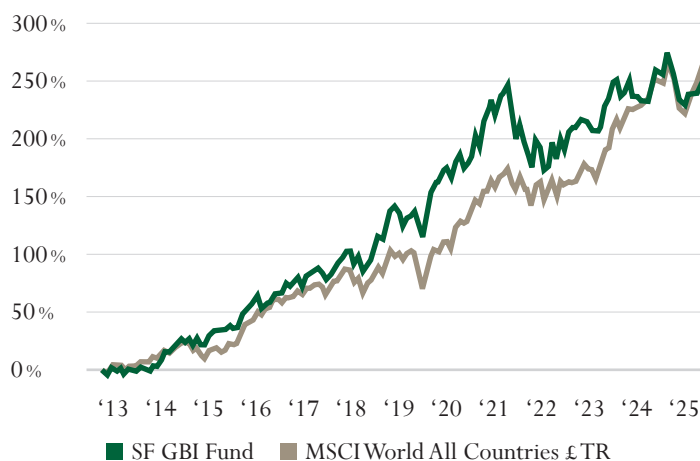
