

#### **PORTFOLIO COMMENTARY**

Financial assets have staged a significant recovery in value so far in 2019. In spite of generally weak economic data, market participants have focused on the unwinding of the biggest concerns that confronted investors in 2018. Firstly, the Federal Reserve have adjusted their future hike path meaning the probability of a further interest rate hike in 2019 has collapsed. At the same time, a resolution between the US and China over trade terms has become increasingly likely. Global equity markets have responded favourably to these developments and have rallied 10.0% in Sterling terms so far this year. Fixed Income securities have also generated positive returns with the Global Aggregate up 2.6% in hedged GBP terms, as government bond yields have fallen in conjunction with a rally in corporate credit.

The portfolio generated a net return of 8.2% over Q1 2019 versus the benchmark return of 8.5%. Orbis was one of our managers that struggled to keep pace with the broader market. This was due to a number of idiosyncratic factors including their position in XPO logistics, which detracted significantly. The SF Global Best Ideas Fund was the best performing strategy, returning 12.0%, and outperformed global equity markets by 2.0% thanks to positive stock selection within Healthcare, Staples and Technology. We added the iShares Nasdaq 100 ETF to the portfolio in January in order to increase exposure to mega-cap Technology companies after valuations reset in Q4 2018. Tech has since resumed market leadership with the likes of Facebook, Apple and Netflix all returning in excess of 20% so far this year. Another addition was the Man GLG UK Undervalued Assets Fund managed by Henry Dixon. Due to ongoing Brexit uncertainty, UK equities are currently trading at compelling discounts to global peers. This strategy provides exposure to UK domestic firms which we think will benefit the most from the potential of a "softer" Brexit outcome.

#### **ACTIVE MANAGERS IN FOCUS**

The portfolio blends a mix of active, passive and factor strategies. Approximately 50% of the portfolio is invested in active managers where our conviction is the strongest. Below we outline two examples.

#### Man GLG Japan Core Alpha Equity

This strategy invests into large and mega cap Japanese equities with the aim of outperforming the TOPIX Index. The Fund is managed by Stephen Harker, who has over 30 years' experience investing into Japanese equities, and two supporting portfolio managers. The portfolio typically consists of 50 to 70 stocks and has a slight bias towards Value, whereby the Fund rotates out of stocks which have performed strongly and into names that are temporarily out of favour. The Fund is currently overweight Banks, Automakers and Real Estate names whilst remaining underweight Healthcare, Consumer Staples and Tech.

#### Lyxor/Sandler US Equity Fund

Sandler is a broad market US long/short specialist with over 20 years' experience running this strategy. Portfolio construction is more dynamic than peers in terms of both stock selection and the management of net exposure; the latter is calibrated by their views of the top down environment, with special consideration given to the credit cycle. The strategy does have a Growth bias, which we feel the manager has the ability to moderate when the environment becomes less constructive. This should also contribute as a diversifier for the Value leaning characteristics of much of our existing US exposure.
