# **FUND COMMENTARY**

This September has lived up to its historic reputation as the weakest month of the year. The MSCI ACTR index lost -4.1% over the month, bringing the year-to-date return to a still solid +11.1%.

This year there are more than just normal seasonal factors causing this weakness. Investors are climbing a wall of worry on several fronts. Central Bank tapering seems to be closer than previously thought. The US government is struggling to lift its debt ceiling in time and has risk of running out of funds to pay normal operational costs. Forces are building to replace Powell as the Federal Reserve Chair. Continuing major supply chain issues may extend the high inflation transitory phase, with views of potential stagflation gaining some traction.

China is also playing a major role in the current market volatility. Continued regulatory clampdowns have caused material investor uncertainties. The Evergrande debacle has elevated the risk of some China property sector related debt defaults. The Chinese economy experiences material power shortages. This is restraining the world's second largest economy with the September Manufacturing PMI dropping below the neutral 50 level. These power shortages can contribute to keep energy and shipping costs higher for longer, further negatively affecting the economy and global trade.

We do not believe a major portion of these issues are structural in nature, and that continuing effects from the pandemic are the dominant cause for the supply line disruptions manifesting in different ways. On this front, we can already see clearly how effective the vaccines have been in containing the virus' negative health effects and that the world can live with it.

The last quarter of the year has historically been a strong one. Whilst the current immediate economic outlook seems uncertain, the main issue for us remains to invest for structural growth in quality businesses. In some cases, we can now do so at more attractive valuations than a month ago.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Fund is a sub-fund of the Stonehage Fleming Pooled Investments (Ireland) plc (the "Company"), an open-ended umbrella investment company with variable capital and segregated liability between Funds incorporated with limited liability in Ireland under the Companies Act 2014 with registration number 525228. It qualifies and is authorised in Ireland by the Central Bank of Ireland as an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS").

The Company is recognised as a section 264 scheme by the Financial Conduct Authority in the United Kingdom. The Fund is an approved Foreign Collective Investment Scheme in South Africa where it is registered with the Financial Sector Conduct Authority (South Africa). The Fund has been granted consent pursuant to the Control of Borrowing (Jersey) Order 1958, by the Jersey Financial Services Commission ("JFSC") to circulate an offer for subscription, sale or exchange of shares in Jersey. The JFSC is protected by the Control of Borrowing (Jersey) Law 1947, as amended, against liability arising from

the discharge of its functions under that Law. Link Fund Administrators (Ireland) Limited has been appointed as the manager (the "Manager") of the Company and Stonehage Fleming Investment Management Limited has been appointed as the investment manager (the "Investment Manager") of the Company.
