



# **FUND COMMENTARY**

The Fund returned 1.4% during the quarter versus the estimated benchmark return of 3.6%. Global equity markets rallied in the final quarter of the year following a significant de-rating in equity markets during the first nine months of the year and as data pointed to US inflation having peaked. US equities struggled versus other regions which was partly due to a weaker US dollar and a number of its larger constituents struggling - Tesla, Amazon, Alphabet and Apple. European and UK equities were the best performers and were aided by having low levels of technology company representation within their indices.

Strategies that performed particularly well during the quarter included our more Value focused European manager and UK managers, JO Hambro and GLG Undervalued Assets. In the case of the former, there was a significant recovery in some of the more economically sensitive names, such as steel producer, Thyssenkrupp, and catering business, Elior. GLG benefitted from its higher allocation to the banks and energy companies and lower allocations

to areas like consumer staple businesses. Somewhat surprisingly in this rebounding market, our dedicated insurance and healthcare positions also performed well having protected capital well in the previous nine months.

It was the higher quality and growth focused strategies that continued to lag their respective indices. These included Stonehage Fleming Global Best Ideas, Driehaus and Veritas Asia. Driehaus, the weakest performing position, saw the least benefit from a weaker US dollar given the high US domestic exposure.

Activity during the quarter including selling our sterling hedged position in US manager, Findlay Park, and switching that into an unhedged Findlay Park share class; this was done in December after a significantly rally of sterling against the US dollar. We also reduced our US equity exposure towards the end of the year in favour of emerging markets, with the latter seeing improving sentiment on China's unwinding its zero-COVID policy.
