PORTFOLIO COMMENTARY

The Global Multi-Asset Portfolio C GBP Class returned 1.8% vs 2.3% for the benchmark. Global equity markets fell in August in USD terms as the US central bank made it clear that it will prioritise bringing inflation under control even if there is short-term pain to the economy. Many investors have been hoping the Federal Reserve would be forced to pivot and cut rates in the face of recession fears, but this now appears less likely in the short-term. Sectors that struggled in the month included Technology and Healthcare. Technology has been one of the sectors more sensitive to rate rises, whilst sentiment was weak in the Healthcare sector amid the passing of the Inflation Reduction Act. Returns in sterling were higher and aided by the pound weakening against the US dollar.

Within the equity book, it was a difficult month in aggregate. This was partly due to higher allocations to healthcare and slightly higher exposure to growth businesses. Notable detractors included Stonehage Fleming Global Best Ideas and Edgewood. Both look for high quality and faster growing companies which typically trade at a premium to the market, and this area was out of favour. A few of the difficult positions in the month included semiconductor company, ASML, and med tech company, Intuitive Surgical, which they both hold. Areas of the equity book that performed well included our US small cap manager, Driehaus. US smaller companies had a better month, and their stock selection within Technology was also good. Our dedicated exposure to global non-life insurance, Polar Insurance, continued to hold up well amid broader weakness — the reinsurers such as Everest Re and RGA performed well.

As has been the case for much of the year, it was a difficult month for the bond market as well as the equity market. Sovereign yields rose across geographies resulting in negative absolute returns for the fixed income securities in the Fund.

The alternatives positions had a mixed month but generally had a better month than equities and fixed income. Our best performing position was our global long/short equity strategy, Marshall Wace ESG TOPS Fund, which continues to have a good year.

ACTIVE MANAGER IN FOCUS

Artisan US Focus Fund

The Artisan US Focus Fund is an equity fund investing predominantly in the US market. The team employ an investment philosophy which blends in-depth thematic idea generation with bottom-up fundamental stock selection. They start by seeking out inflections in multi-year trends, which are often misunderstood by the market, allowing them to take a differentiated view on industry fundamentals.

The team use their approach to construct a focused portfolio of 20-40 stocks, which is designed to maximise alpha whilst limiting downside risk. These stocks will typically sit across 5-8 themes, with each theme sized around 10%-30%.

The fund is managed by Chris Smith and is supported by a team of 7 investment professionals. The manager is not wedded to a philosophical style bias, and is very mindful of factor risks in the portfolio. Historically the fund has however demonstrated leanings towards some more growth thematics, though the manager has actively sought to balance this risk and introduce more value themes at various times.
