MANAGER PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

GRIF outperformed global equities in Q4 2023 as the outperformance of Growth as well as small and mid-caps and the weak performance of the Energy sector were relative tailwinds for the strategy. The relative headwind of being underweight the "Magnificent 7" was also less extreme. Most underlying managers outperformed broader global equities over the quarter, with Regnan Global Equity Impact Solutions particularly strong, helped by a number of investments into environmental names, which were helped in part by COP28's missive to "transition away from fossil fuel".




