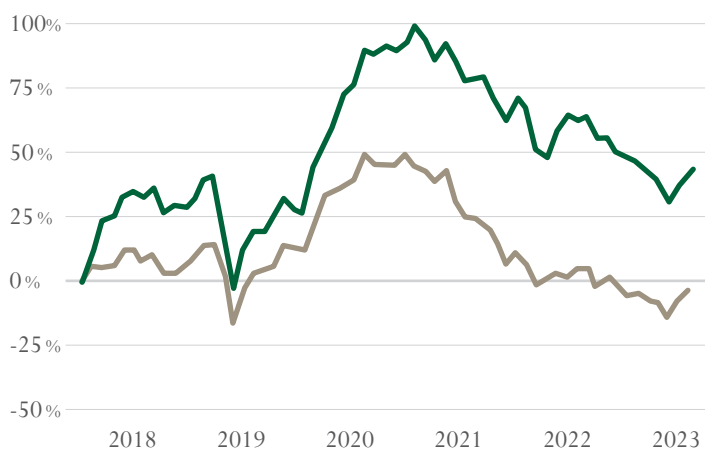
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The Fund aims to invest mainly in equities on the UK Alternative Investment Market ('AIM'). This will be achieved by an actively managed diversified portfolio of shares spread across any sector of AIM. In addition, the Fund may on occasion invest in fully listed shares of companies with smaller market capitalisations.

PORTFOLIO COMMENTARY

UK smaller companies and particularly those listed on AIM performed poorly in 2023 which was a year dominated by rising interest rates on the back of high inflation. The year closed on more positive news with inflation falling to 3.9% in November which compared to 4.6% in the previous month and the peak of 11.1% in October 2022. Interest rates were pegged at 5.25% and might remain at that level in the early months of 2024 with the promise of a possible reduction later in the year. In his November Autumn Statement, the Chancellor of the Exchequer announced some taxation cuts and set the scene for the likelihood of further reductions. A similar situation exists in the United States where the Fed interest rates are held steady at 5.5% and the November inflation figure was 3.1%. 2024 is likely to be the biggest election year in history when 40 countries and more than half the world population going to the polls. It seems likely that with a General Election in the UK and Presidential one in the US will be accompanied by moves to stimulate the respective economies. This may well be the reason behind a more positive tone in places for stock markets in December. However, the continuing Russia/Ukraine conflict and escalation of the Israel/Gaza situation provides some continued uncertainty.

Shares of smaller companies in the oil and gas sector have remained depressed. Oil and gas prices remained relatively stable in December which experienced relatively mild weather conditions. Higher production figures were seen from the US which offset modest cuts from OPEC members. A short-term influence on prices could be the effects of attack on merchant shipping in the Red Sea causing some freight to avoid the Suez Canal. It also remains to be seen if any cold spell will extend through the early weeks of 2024. On balance we would look for oil and natural gas prices to remain around present levels. Under such circumstances companies in the sector should achieve reasonable profits to enable capital to be invested in drilling programmes. We have a good exposure to companies operating in the North Sea and see prospects of an attractive re-rating for those shares. Even though there might be industry uncertainty if there is a change in government, it seems unlikely that the Labour party would want to encourage or rely upon only foreign energy imports. We feel that our holdings in the sector offer sound longer term prospects and should provide attractive returns for the fund. On the political front, a General Election is unlikely until the Autumn by which time tax incentives might be introduced with also the possibility of lower interest rates. We have little concern on the outcome for economic growth as this seems a likely campaign for all political parties. In the month we sold our holding in Billington Holdings and for technical reasons, made further reductions in our MS International holding. We added no new holdings but increased our interest in a number of existing ones. Looking ahead into the New Year we think that sentiment should eventually return to smaller companies, many of which are quoted at exceedingly attractive levels. Takeover activity might also increase and we feel that, our stock picking approach leaves us well placed to take advantage of any opportunities that might arise.
