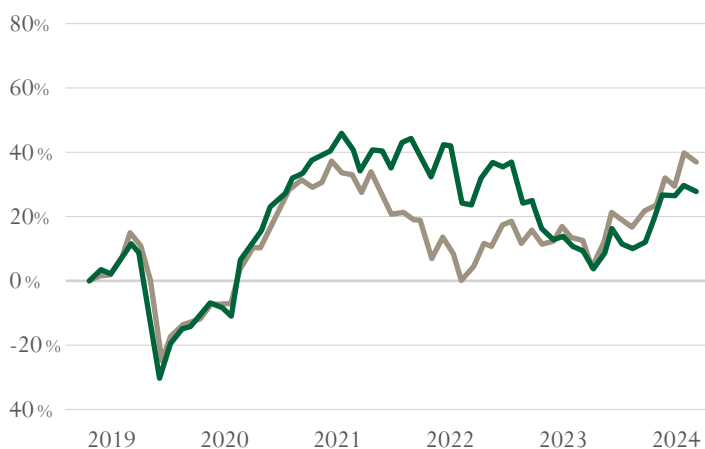
## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth.

## INVESTMENT POLICY

The Fund aims to invest in equities falling mainly under the following categories: smaller companies which offer long-term growth; companies which offer recovery prospects; and companies in sectors which are perceived to be unduly depressed. There is no geographical restriction but in practice the fund will be mainly invested in the UK.

## PORTFOLIO COMMENTARY

The incoming Labour Government have hit the road running and adopted a responsible tone. Rachael Reeve, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, after consultation with Office for Budget Responsibility (OBR), claimed that there was a £21.9 billion overspend by the previous Conservative Government which needed to be funded. In a surprise move she announced that the winter fuel subsidy is to be removed from the majority of recipients and further funding measures would be announced in the Autumn Statement on 30 October. It was reconfirmed that there would be no change in income tax, corporation tax, national insurance and VAT meaning that some capital projects could be abandoned or deferred. It has also been speculated that there could be changes in capital gains tax, inheritance tax and pensions. The Prime Minister stated that the priority was to grow the economy with wealth creation the aim but it would not happen overnight and there would be some tough decisions. On an encouraging note, Sterling has been strong and the Bank of England base rate was reduced from 5.25% to 5%. The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) voted on this change despite inflation rising from 2% to 2.2% by the year end. Although there is an element of uncertainty moving forward, investment sentiment has not changed and the majority of companies are looking to the future with confidence.

During the month Hargreaves Lansdown received an agreed takeover offer and we decided to sell our holding as we saw greater value elsewhere in the stock market. For a similar reason we also sold our interest in Vodafone. A new holding was taken in Croda International the specialist chemical company where the share price fell back on disappointing results from its crop protection division. It also suffered from destocking in the life science division and the shares now offer good recovery prospects as the issues subside. We added to Wood Group (oil services) when the share price slumped after a possible takeover bid was withdrawn. Other additions were made to BP (oil and gas), Direct Line (insurance), Lion Trust (asset management) and several smaller companies. In our view the portfolio is well positioned and would benefit from any further interest rate cuts in coming months but this depends upon inflation being kept under control at a time when the Government has been awarding significant pay awards in the public sector. Global factor including the war in Ukraine and conflicts in the Middle East could be an unsettling factor but, equally, any solution would bring welcome relief.
