Objectives and Investment Policy

The objective and investment policy of the Fund Aims to deliver capital returns in excess of the Morgan Stanley Capital International (MSCI) UK IMI Net Return GBP Index (net of fees) with lower absolute volatility (as measured against the absolute volatility of this index) over a period of 5 to 7 years, as well as annual yield above the same index.

At least 50% of the portfolio will be invested in UK companies listed on a global stock market. In addition, at least 95% of the portfolio is expected to be invested in equities.

Equity exposure may be obtained through equity and equity linked securities including shares, depositary receipts, warrants and other participation rights, convertible securities, index and participation notes and equity linked notes. Despite the emphasis on UK equities, the Fund may at times hold significant levels of cash to manage volatility or to protect the Fund from stock market corrections.

In seeking to generate additional income, the Fund will also regularly sell call and put options with respect to particular securities or positions held by the Fund. A put option is a contract allowing its holder the right to sell a number of shares at a pre-determined price within a specified time period. A call option is a contract allowing its holder the right to purchase a number of shares at a pre-determined price within a specified time period.

Its flexibility, value driven style and yield enhancement strategy mean that the total return of the Fund will diverge from that of the Morgan Stanley Capital International (MSCI) UK IMI Net Return GBP Index.

Derivatives and forward transactions may be used by the Fund for the purposes of hedging or EPM Purposes.

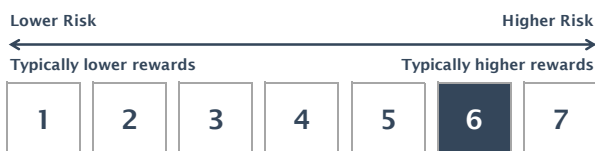
The Fund uses the Morgan Stanley Capital International (MSCI) UK IMI Net Return GBP Index as a target benchmark.

This benchmark is considered appropriate as it is representative of the constituents in which the Fund seeks to invest.

The base currency of the Fund is pounds sterling.

Income arising from the Fund is distributed to the holders of income units. Investors can buy and sell units on demand when the scheme prices daily at 10.30 pm.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk rating of the Fund is category 6 due to the volatility of the Fund price which sits in a range of between 15% and 25%. The risk rating is calculated using historical data and a prescribed standard deviation methodology.

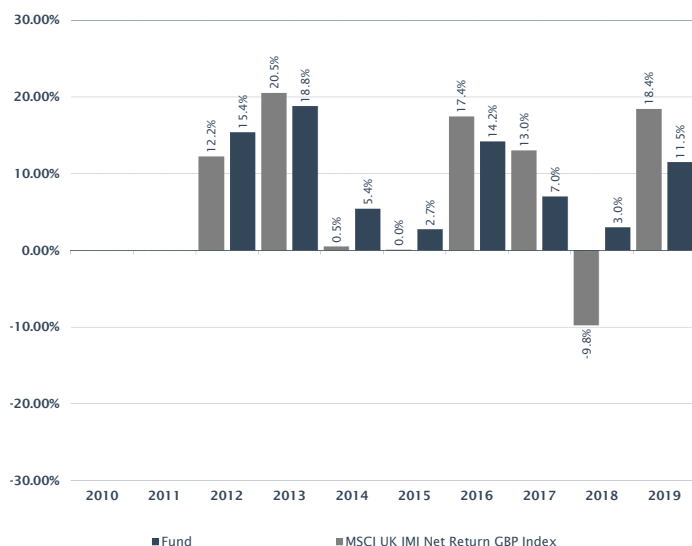
The entry and exit charges shown are maximum figures. In some cases you might pay less - you can find this out from your financial adviser.
