GROUP DONATIONS

Since the last newsletter the Group has donated to multiple charities including, [The Duke of Edinburgh’s International Award Foundation](#), [Afrika Tikkun](#), [Great Ormond Street Hospital](#), [the Laureus Foundation](#) and [the World Monuments Fund](#).

We are proud to share an update on our three-year commitment to supporting the [Duke of Edinburgh’s International Award Foundation \(DoEIA\)](#). This partnership, delivered in collaboration with our charitable partner, [Afrika Tikkun](#), has had an extraordinary impact on young people in disadvantaged communities in South Africa. Through the President’s Award for Youth Empowerment, the programme equips participants with essential life skills, resilience, and confidence to thrive in their personal and professional lives.

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION

The Duke of Edinburgh’s International Award empowers young individuals to push their boundaries — both mentally and physically — through challenging and transformative experiences. Regardless of their background, culture, physical abilities, or interests, participants are encouraged to grow, learn, and achieve. The programme isn’t a competition against others but a deeply personal challenge to unlock their potential.

In the first year of our collaboration, 140 young people across Afrika Tikkun’s five centres began their Award journey. From trekking to painting, tutoring to creative workshops, they embraced a variety of activities that fostered growth and resilience. The results were remarkable: while we anticipated 70% of Bronze Award graduates would progress to Silver, an unprecedented 90% have done so. Additionally, 140 new Bronze candidates have signed up for Year Two, with a growing waiting list.



DEVELOPING SKILLS AND CONFIDENCE THROUGH THE ARTS

In August 2023, Bronze and Silver participants took part in creative holiday workshops, including music, dance, theatre, and writing. These sessions not only enriched their artistic abilities but also supported their academic learning. Participants learned key skills such as audience connection, voice projection, and writing techniques, culminating in a Talent Day that showcased their development and potential.

Participants explored creative writing, poetry, and performance techniques, building confidence and enhancing their self-esteem. Through physical recreation, teamwork, and collaboration, they also developed healthier habits and improved their mental well-being.

ADVENTURE, GROWTH, AND ACHIEVEMENT

The New Year brought fresh excitement as Bronze and Silver participants embarked on their Adventurous Journeys—a vital component of the Award. These journeys challenged participants to step out of their comfort zones, develop self-discovery, and embrace teamwork in a supportive environment.

Reflecting on the experience, Bronze participant Somila Nqeketho shared:

“The programme has been helping me a lot. I learned a lot of things in this programme including being physically fit (exercising regularly) and also being of service to others, and helping without expecting something in return.”

Also, Silver participant Inathi Petsenge said:

“It was a privilege to be a part of the programme, but it was also a tough challenge that came with many obstacles. However, I managed to adapt to the challenges and learned to work with others while testing my own abilities.”

CELEBRATING SUCCESS

In March and April 2024, Afrika Tikkun hosted graduation ceremonies across their centres to celebrate the achievements of 215 Bronze and Silver Award graduates. From Wings of Life in Diepsloot to Zolile Malindi in Mfuleni, these events highlighted the participants’ dedication, perseverance, and commitment to leadership and social impact.

MENTORING THE FUTURE

Stonehage Fleming also proudly reinitiated a mentoring programme with Afrika Tikkun facilitators. Special thanks to our team members—Miki Caves, Thomas Withington, James Cook, Lucy Goldman, William Morris, Henry Kelleher, Michael McGeough, and Eva Sheppard—for volunteering their time and expertise to support these remarkable young individuals.

YEAR 2: A TESTAMENT TO PROGRESS SUCCESS

As Year 2 ends, the programme has seen outstanding results, with 83% of the 257 participants earning their Bronze or Silver Award. These achievements underscore the life-changing impact of the collaboration between Afrika Tikkun and the DoEIA. A recent evaluation highlighted significant increases in resilience among participants, with consistently strong scores across multiple life domains.

LOOKING AHEAD TO GOLD

We're eagerly anticipating Year Three, where our first Gold Award participants will embark on the programme's most challenging and rewarding level yet. This journey will mark another milestone in our mission to empower young people and create lasting change.

In September, Afrika Tikkun celebrated 30 years of transformative impact with a meet-and-greet session at the London office. The event showcased the inspiring journeys of four young women from Alexandra Centre who completed the Duke of Edinburgh (DOE) Award. During the evening, Carole Day and Marc Lubner, CEO and Executive Chair of Afrika Tikkun respectively, welcomed guests as they honoured three decades of dedication to empowering communities and transforming lives across South Africa.

November was again a very productive month at Afrika Tikkun with students gearing up for various activities as part of the ongoing DOE programme.

During the month, the programme achieved significant progress in developing personal growth, leadership abilities, and community engagement among participants from various centres. Despite tight timetables and system delays (due to connectivity challenges), the programme has reached key milestones in Voluntary Service, Skills Development, and Physical Recreation.

The Gauteng Centre planned an Adventurous Journey trip for Gold participants within the next month.

The voyage lasted four days and three nights, with participants having the opportunity to participate in a tough yet rewarding expedition.

GROUP DONATIONS



Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH) is one of the world’s leading children’s hospitals. Founded in 1852 by Dr Charles West, who was driven to set up a children’s hospital by the shockingly high level of infant mortality in London.

The hospital started in a seventeenth century townhouse with just 10 beds and two physicians. Since then, GOSH has become a place where multi-disciplinary teams of healthcare professionals and scientists improve the lives of children with rare or complex diseases.

Through carrying out research with local, national and international partners, GOSH has developed a number of new clinical treatments and techniques that are used across the NHS and around the world.

It hosts the UK’s only National Institute for Health and Care Research funded **Biomedical Research Centre (NIHR GOSH BRC)** that solely focuses on child health, and is also home to the **NIHR GOSH Clinical Research Facility**, which provides specialist day care accommodation for children and young people taking part in clinical research studies.



The **World Monuments Fund (WMF)** is the leading independent organization devoted to safeguarding the world’s most treasured places to enrich people’s lives and build mutual understanding across cultures and communities.

Since 1965, their global team of experts has preserved the world’s diverse cultural heritage using the highest international standards at more than 700 sites in 112 countries. Partnering with local communities, funders, and governments, the WMF draws on heritage to address some of today’s most pressing challenges: climate change, underrepresentation, imbalanced tourism, and post-crisis recovery. With a commitment to the people who bring places to life, the WMF embraces the potential of the past to create a more resilient and inclusive society.

ABRAHAM KRIEL BAMBANANI



Abraham Kriel Bambanani is a registered non-profit organisation providing care and skills development for traumatised children and youth in need, in the greater Johannesburg area. It provides shelter, physical care, rehabilitation and skills development for beneficiaries who have been subjected to trauma, abuse, molestation, poverty, neglect and unemployment. This is done via residential care, community services and educational programmes.

LIFTING DREAMS



Lifting Dreams is a registered non-profit company which specialises in community upliftment through educational support in underprivileged schools and communities. They currently run a weekly academic programme in Soweto, Mamelodi, and Potchefstroom. Their education program is facilitated by both contract tutors, and an amazing team of volunteers to help children excel at various academic levels.



SOUTH AFRICA

AFRIKA TIKKUN BAMBANANI (ATB)



Afrika Tikkun Bambanani (ATB) is the coming together of Afrika Tikkun and Bambanani Sifunde. The ATB programme has brought together a team of teachers, theorists, educators, investors and therapists to create the best ECD curriculum available in South Africa.

ART SCHOOL AFRICA



Art School Africa, a non-profit organisation established in 2022, they are dedicated to empowering individuals across the African continent to kickstart or advance their careers in the art industry. In partnership with the Harvard University Center for African Studies, they conduct comprehensive research, spanning countries such as South Africa, Kenya, and Ghana, to gain profound insights into the distinctive challenges faced by art practitioners as they embark on their professional journeys.

CHEVRAH KADISHA



The Chevrah Kadisha, affectionately known as the “Chev”, is the largest Jewish welfare organisation on the African continent and the oldest in Johannesburg. What started out as a burial society in 1888, has evolved into a full-scale welfare organisation caring for the needs of Jews from cradle to grave. The Chev has operated for 134 years and 82% of their annual budget is expended on welfare and providing care to those unable to care for themselves. Over 70% of that budget must be fund-raised through the generosity of their donor partners.



ALZU TOUR DE FARM

The heart and motivation behind the Alzu Tour de Farm originated from the need and the will to give back to the children of Middelburg. This race is a family event with different distance categories, it draws competitive riders from all over the country and hosts between 1,000 and 1,500 cyclists every year – making it one of the biggest mountain bike races in Mpumalang and the fastest mountain bike race in South Africa! Their main beneficiaries include, Middelburg Primary School, Middelburg Hoërskool and Care Village, the local orphanage.



AXIUM EDUCATION

Axiom Education employs local community members to run education intervention programs. 15 years of pioneering work in improving rural education, their school leadership communities of practice strengthen over 33 schools, 30,500 sandwiches provided yearly so that their learners can focus on learning and not on their empty stomachs. Their work directly impacts 6,265 rural learners and over 2,687 children have regular access to books through community-based reading clubs, additionally, 169 volunteers & visitors have come from far and wide to advance the mission.

By focusing on the three pillars of golf, education and lifeskills, the Foundation constantly celebrates the success of its former members – and it certainly is not only on the golf course where that success is achieved!

UCT ONLINE HIGH SCHOOL'S



UCT Online High School's mission is to accelerate access to world-class high school education, so that they can unleash South Africa's potential. They're a team of mothers, fathers, dreamers, innovators, and believers who want the best for their children. They don't just believe in a brighter future; but believe in doing everything possible to make it happen.

HOME FROM HOME



Home from Home believes strongly in the power of family. Since 2005, their organisation has successfully provided support and family-style foster care to orphaned, abused, neglected and vulnerable children. They have grown significantly over the years and now run 36 homes in the greater Western Cape region of South Africa. In South Africa, the number of vulnerable children is staggering, it is crucial to tap into the natural resilience, hope and sense of community that exists. The African philosophy of Ubuntu, of being interconnected and sharing a sense of compassion and community is at the core of their purpose in building loving families. The success of their work has resulted in numerous organisations in South Africa using their Model of Care.

NORVAL FOUNDATION



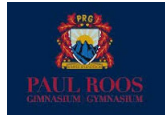

UCT Online High School's Mentoring



PAUL ROOS GYMNASIUM



Founded in 1866, this school is only a step away from the University of Stellenbosch and a variety of amenities, from sport to internet facilities, is shared with this institution. Paul Roos Gymnasium succeeds in preparing its pupils for the world of study, leisure and work. Since the establishment of the Chancellor’s Medal of the University of Stellenbosch, 9 Paul Roosers have received the prestigious award. Together with Diocesan College (Bishops), the school produced the largest number of Springbok rugby players (54).

RAYMOND ACKERMAN GOLF ACADEMY (RAGA)



In 2003, Clovelly Country Club launched a golf and caddy development programme to encourage transformation in golf. Young people living in the nearby areas of Ocean View and Masiphumelele benefitted not only from learning the skills required to play golf but also from the life skills inherent in the game. The programme was gradually expanded to meet the needs of the children and in 2007 Jonathan Ackerman founded the Raymond Ackerman Golf Academy (RAGA) as a Trust. Over the years, RAGA has grown into a unique youth development programme offering extensive after school academic support, a wide range of life skills activities and coaching in the fundamentals of golf under the guidance of qualified PGA professionals.

HATZOLA

Hatzola is a non-profit, volunteer organisation established in 1979 to provide prehospital emergency medical response and transportation at no cost, to the North London community. Hatzola responds to thousands of emergencies every year, from minor injuries to life-threatening conditions.

ROTARY CLUB OF NEWLANDS



The Rotary Club of Newlands was chartered in 1994 and are now one of the largest clubs in their district and boast a vibrant membership of people between the ages of 28 – 80. Their club raises most of its funding through the management of marshals and other volunteer staff for events like the Cape Town Cycle Tour and the Cape Town Marathon to realise the vision of a country where every citizen has access to water and sanitation, education, basic healthcare, entrepreneurial opportunity and much more.

THE UNITED JEWISH CAMPAIGN (UJC)



The United Jewish Campaign (UJC) is the Cape Town Jewish Community’s umbrella fundraising body. In many ways, the UJC is the engine room of the community, powering its various organs and maintaining its vitality, viability, and ongoing growth and development. Through various fundraising events, campaigns and initiatives, the UJC sends funding pulsing through the veins of the community, bringing to life the constellation of schools, welfare organisations, and other communal bodies ensuring these institutions have the funding they need to fulfil their own crucial purposes fostering one of the most vibrant Jewish communities in the diaspora.





SOUTH AFRICA

UPLANDS OUTREACH



Uplands Outreach originated to be a self-supporting programme that would benefit the disadvantaged schools in the surrounding local community by providing expertise and facilities to overcome the disparity in educational standards. It has grown from strength to strength over the years, had a huge boost in 2019 with the building of the Japhet Outreach Centre which has helped the Outreach team with their continuing vision of ‘raising achievement for all’.

PONDOLAND CONSERVATION TRUST



Brad Fainsinger from our Johannesburg office took part in the Pondo Coaster trail run. It’s was a three-stage team event (36km, 34km, 33km) from Port Edward to Port St Johns along the Wild Coast of South Africa. Stonehage Fleming supported him by donating R250 for every km he finished. R25,750 was donated to the charities **Pondoland Conservation Trust** and **Miles for Smiles**.

The Pondoland Conservation Trust — Fights for our planet through ecofriendly, non-invasive community development and food production; whilst actively resisting any unscrupulous exploitation along our coastline.

The Miles for Smiles Foundation — Facilitate reconstructive surgery to children born with cleft lip or palates. One in every ten babies born in Africa with a cleft palate die before their first birthday. A relatively simple and quick operation results in a life-changing smile for these children.

ZIP ZAP



Zip Zap is a vibrant, uniquely South African social and professional circus. Through circus arts they inspire and empower young people from all walks of life to pursue their destinies. They promote social cohesion, create opportunities, unlock potential and transfer skills for life.

VOLUNTEER WILDFIRE SERVICES (VWS)



The **Volunteer Wildfire Services (VWS)** has been on the front line, combating dangerous and sometimes deadly runaway wildfires since its inception during the devastating fires that ravaged Cape Town in 1999/2000. With a force of more than 350 volunteers, with women making up 34% of their volunteers, who operate from the four stations, Newlands, South Peninsula, Stellenbosch, and Helderberg. VWS is the largest volunteer firefighting organisation in South Africa. VWS stands tall as a powerful non-profit organization, driven by a team of fiercely passionate volunteers.





JERSEY

Their aim is to be a safe, enclosed environment for children with additional needs to play, socialise with their peers and have a place where they can be completely themselves with no judgement.

Jersey Sports Association for the disabled (JSAD) is a charitable organisation and was formed 40 years ago with the purpose of providing support and encouragement to local residents with a disability who wish to take part in sport. It was, and remains, the general ethos that sport should be available to all, regardless of age or disability, and be fun!

CENTREPOINT



The objective of **Centrepoint** is to promote the welfare of children in Jersey by providing child-first, leading quality childcare in nurturing environments within their nurseries, playcare and special needs centres. Centrepoint provide the absolute best possible start for the island's children supporting their emotional, physical and mental development through exploration, learning and fun.

JERSEY ASSOCIATION FOR YOUTH & FRIENDSHIP



Jersey Association for Youth & Friendship (JAYF) is a charity founded in 1961 in Jersey. They are committed to helping young people experiencing homelessness by providing safe, secure accommodation. Their aim is to work proactively with young people facing complex barriers to help develop the skills they need to live independently.

JERSEY STROKE SUPPORT



Jersey Stroke Support is a local charity supporting stroke survivors and their families by providing post-stroke reviews and raising awareness about stroke in the community.



PYJAMA FAIRIES



Pyjama Fairies is the only UK charity to make pyjamas and surgical gowns specially designed for babies and children up to age 16 having surgery or any other associated medical test. Each garment is made in colourful, age-appropriate fabric and is designed to minimise discomfort when medical intervention is necessary.

WETWHEELS

Wetwheels provides the opportunity for all disabled people, including those with profound and complex disabilities, to access the sea in a safe, stimulating and rewarding way on board specially-built, fully-accessible powerboats. By offering the opportunity to experience this as active participants they build confidence and improve physical and mental wellbeing.

RNLI JERSEY



RNLI Jersey is a highly trained team of volunteers operating from two lifeboat stations (St Helier and St Catherine’s) in Jersey, Channel Islands. During the summer months they are supported by our paid lifeguards who patrol Jersey’s western beaches. They are part of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution which operates across the UK, Channel Islands and Republic of Ireland and which is made up primarily of volunteers united by selflessness, skill and courage.

TINY SEEDS



Tiny Seeds is a charity dedicated to supporting people in Jersey who are experiencing infertility or who need the help of fertility treatments to conceive. Through their monthly support meetings, regular meetings to discuss specific areas of treatment and infertility and a private online support group they provide practical and emotional support while helping people to know that they are not alone during what can be an incredibly difficult and very isolating time in their lives. They have an established link with the Government of Jersey Health Service in order to be the voice for fertility service users with regard to treatments, services and funding provided.

EVELINA CHILDREN’S CHARITY



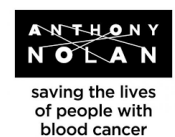

The team in London took part in the annual J.P. Morgan Corporate Challenge. Due to their location and its proximity to the Gaza Strip, the medical staff hold the responsibility for medical treatment and health care of the many citizens hospitalized or are evacuated to the medical center due to missile attack, as well as treatment of soldiers injured during conflict.

The center is committed to continue serving all people in need of their services with professionalism and loyalty and continue to develop more advanced services for the welfare of the residents.

THE ISRAELI FRIENDS OF MAGEN DAVID ADOM



The **Israeli Friends of Magen David Adom (MDA)** is the sole authorised fundraising organisation within Israel, dedicated to providing financial support for the lifesaving efforts of MDA.

BRING THEM HOME NOW



Bring Them Home Now was formed after the attack on Israeli villages and towns in 2023. The Hostages and Missing Families Forum is a civil, volunteer-based organization with no political affiliation, focused on bringing loved ones back home by any means necessary through all available channels. The forum includes thousands of volunteers, from the families themselves to senior figures in the security, judicial, communication, advertising, creative, and diplomatic sectors.

MAGEN DAVID ADOM



Magen David Adom is the national rescue organisation recognised by the Israeli law ever since the state was founded, and serves as the formal organisation responsible for emergency pre-hospital medical care and blood services in the country. It handles hundreds of thousands of lifesaving cases every year and provides treatment to any individual who needs it regardless of ethnicity, race, political or religious affiliation.

The MDA belongs to the international Red Cross Movement and provides training and humanitarian aid to countries in need, all over the world.



WESTERN ALZHEIMERS



Western Alzheimers was set up in 1996 as a direct response to the lack of support and services available to people living with dementia in the west of Ireland. From its humble beginnings in a 4-bedroom house in Claremorris it now provides a purpose-built “home from home” overnight respite unit in Ballindine as well as delivering other services to some 5000 families across Galway, Mayo and Roscommon. Their vision, mission and work are all underpinned by their commitment to provide essential support and services that meet the specific needs of people living with dementia across the region each year.

ZAKA, a civilian volunteer organisation with sole responsibility in Israel for dealing with incidents of unnatural death, works in close cooperation with all the emergency services and security forces.

ZAKA has also created a bridge between the various sectors in Israeli society, with the values of volunteerism and dedication as the connecting forces. ZAKA volunteers include among their ranks Jews, Christians, Druze, Bedouin and Moslem; young and old; men and women; religious and secular. ZAKA aids all, regardless of religion, race or creed – because man is made in the divine image.

In 2005, ZAKA received United Nations recognition as an international humanitarian volunteer organization and has since become a model for emergency services around the world, sharing best practices and serving as a light unto the nations in the darkest of times.



LUXEMBOURG

The ING Night Marathon Luxembourg is the largest sports event in the Grand Duchy - and yet scores points above all with its family atmosphere. CARE Luxembourg is a member of the CARE International confederation that supports humanitarian and development programs through technical support, advocacy, fundraising, and communications.

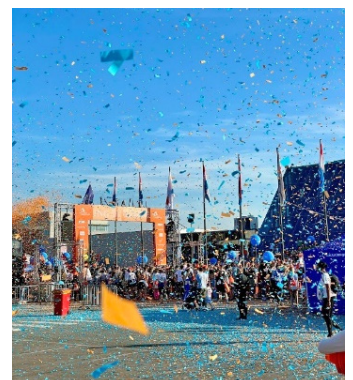

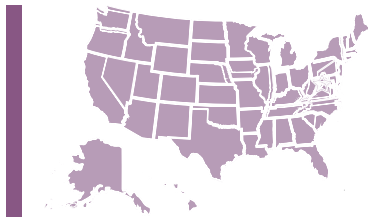

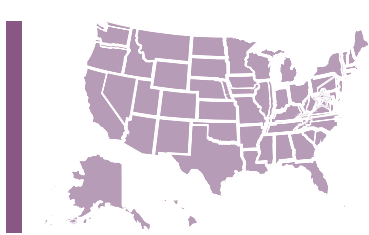
