We are dedicated to supporting local communities and charities across our jurisdictions, below are some of the highlights from the past 6 months.

GROUP GIVING HIGHLIGHTS

In Jersey the team supported a number of local Charities including [Autism Jersey](#), [Jersey Hospice Care](#), [Mind Jersey](#), [Shelter Trust](#), [Beresford Street Kitchen](#) and [Family First](#) through donations and fund raising.

[Mind Jersey](#) is an independent local charity that provides support to people living with mental illness.



[The Shelter Trust](#) was established over 25 years ago and is now the leading provider of accommodation and support services for the homeless community in Jersey.

[Beresford Street Kitchen](#) is a social enterprise providing education, training and employment for people with learning disabilities and autism.



[Family First](#) provide support to families of children in Jersey with illnesses who require specialist off-Island treatment, providing practical support and help in locating resources, services and funding provided by government and voluntary organisations.

[Jersey Hospice Care](#) provides specialist palliative care for everyone who requires it, irrespective of cause.

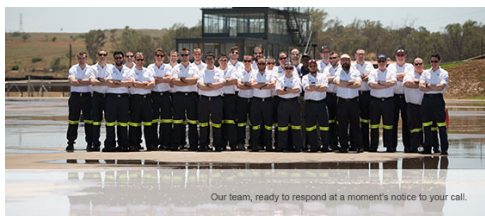


[Autism Jersey](#) is the leading charity in Jersey dedicated to the assistance and support of people on the autism spectrum.

In Switzerland, the teams decided to focus their support on local charity the "[Dispensaire des Rues de Neuchâtel](#)". Donations enabled the charity to put in place a specific "Actions d'aides alimentaire et sanitaire" following the situation around COVID-19.



In South Africa the teams made donations to emergency medical service organisation [Hatzolah](#) and Johannesburg based Business Relief Fund [Chevrah Kadisha's Geshet](#). In celebration of Nelson Mandela International Day the offices also supported [Ladles of Love](#), an organisation that feeds the hungry throughout Cape Town and the [Princess Alice Adoption Home](#) in Johannesburg. Both offices also donated to the [67 Blankets](#) campaign.

[Ladles of Love](#) is a successful and vital part of the support system for homeless and hungry members of the Cape Town community



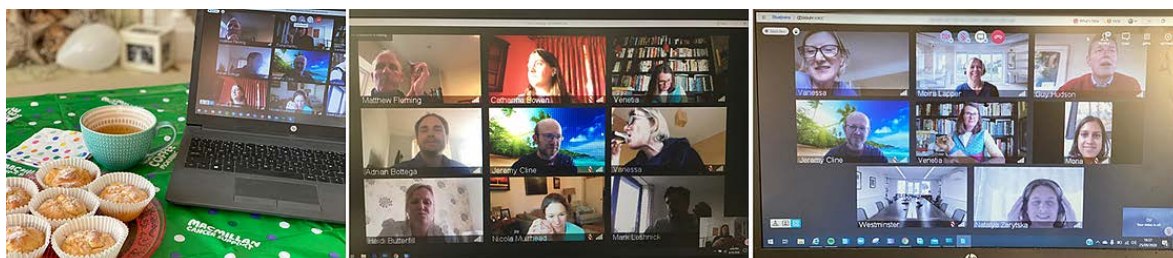

In London employees elected food poverty charity [City Harvest](#) as the UK Office's charity partner for 2020/21 and made a number of donations in the second half of the year. Generous contributions were also made by staff members at the annual Christmas Jumper Day. The team also donated to [Macmillan Cancer Support](#) in June, hosting a virtual coffee morning.

SA GOLF DEVELOPMENT BOARD, SOUTH AFRICA

A donation was made to the SAGDB in December by our South African offices. Since its formation in 1999, the [SAGDB](#) has grown a network of coaches and officials who work across the country to develop the game in the cities and the most remote areas. Over 1 500 players have participated in junior golf tournaments and 34 of its most talented players have been invited to join prestigious and recognised High Performance Centres such as the Ernie Els & Fancourt Foundation.

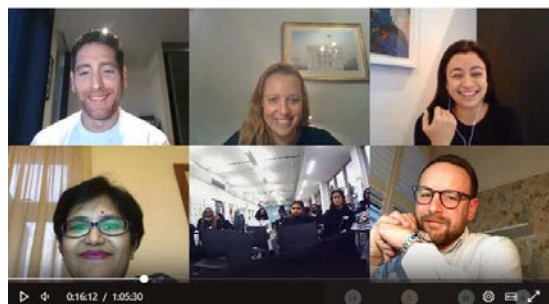
The Foundation accepted public submissions for support up to end of November, successful applicants will receive donations during 21/22. 118 applications were received and will be considered by the trustees for support.
